

Biography: Edi Keller.

In Oct. 1953, Edi emigrated, with his parents, from Linz Austria, to Canada. They moved to Winnipeg to live with relatives, who had immigrated to Canada in the 1920s. Edi's father found the climate there too harsh, and compared it to the winters during his 8-year long service and then imprisonment in Russia, during the war. Eventually, the



family moved to Hamilton, where the father found work as a sheet metal worker. It was during this time, that Edi finished his education and became a hair stylist.

In 1961, Edi met his wife Judi, at his parents' house. They were married one year later. In 1963 he opened his own hair salon, "Burlington Coiffure". The same year the family was blessed with the arrival of their son Michael.

Unfortunately after 10 years as a hair stylist, Edi's health required a change of profession. Consequently, He became an operator with the Hamilton Street Railway, where he remained for 31 years, until his retirement at the age of 57. Edi has been coming to the Germania Club, first as a teenager with his parents, and in 1965 he became a member. Edi and Judi have spent many years volunteering for various Germania Club groups and committees. Their son Michael also used his artistic drafting skills to design dice and posters for casino night. After a period of absence, Michael again joined the Germania Club.

Edi is an honourary member of the Germania Club and is considered one of the founders of the Campers Group. With the help of his friends, Heinz Deipenau and Frank Berndt, he mapped the camping sites, and assisted in transforming the Germania Park into a campground that is still viable today. We are happy that Edi is with us tonight, with his Judi by his side, celebrating 50 years as a member of the Germania Club.

Biography: Erwin Hiller:

We are celebrating today Erwin Hiller's 50th anniversary as a member of the Germania Club. Erwin has been awarded a lifelong membership with the Germania Club, and I am certain that he is known to many of you who make up the old guard.

Erwin was born October 8, 1928 in Heidelsheim in Baden



Württemberg. He landed in Winnipeg on June 27th, 1951. He had studied forestry, but now in a new country, he pursued a career as a licensed mechanic and millwright.

He met his wife Hertha in Winnipeg, and was married on June 27th, 1953. Erwin and Hertha have a son and a daughter.

Erwin had a very colourful working career. He was employed in a gold mine in Manitoba, and in 1957, moved to Ontario, to a job in a uranium mine in Elliot Lake. In 1963, he accepted a position with Stelco in Hamilton, and worked there for $11\frac{1}{2}$ years. He was foreman with a construction firm, but spent his last 15 years as a millwright, working for St. Joseph's Hospital. He retired in 1989, at the age of 61.

Erwin joined the Germania Club in 1965, and became involved in Club activities. In the early seventies, Erwin was Manager of the Germania Club for about 2 years, and was also involved with Narrhalla.

We are happy to have Erwin here with us today to celebrate his milestone anniversary with the Germania Club. Congratulations. Erwin, and please express our best wishes to your wife Hertha as well.




