

Choral Notes

While we were practicing the arrangement of Bach's Menuett, I noticed that it was written in the key of E-flat major (the key with three flats). There is nothing unusual about this key in our time, but it was unusual before the time of Mr. Bach. Let me explain.

Before the time of Bach, tuners and musicians had problems with tuning the semitones and avoided playing pieces with more than two flats or sharps. In harmony with other notes, these semitones often produced wolf sounds.

The problem of tuning was an old one. Within any octave of a major scale there are five full-step notes and two half-step notes, i.e. there are six full steps for eight notes! To avoid the complications in tuning, musicians in ancient times limited themselves to the five full-step notes and considered the others as unmusical. Thus evolved the pentatonic scales. These scales were used globally for thousands of years and are still in use in some modern music.

In the sixth century B.C., the Greek philosopher and mathematician Pythagoras discovered that the pitch emitted by a vibrating string was related to its length. From then on, tuning was not only a matter for the ear; it also had to satisfy principles of science. The ideal tones were pure tones that vibrated without distortions or overtones.

By the Middle Ages musicians discovered the other five semitones within the octave (the black keys on a piano), and tuning became ever more complex. In the year 1482 Ramos de Pareja, yet another musician and mathematician. proposed to divide the octave into twelve equal semitones, all of them tuned at one-half interval higher than its lower neighbour. This fixed the semitones in such a way that C sharp and D flat sounded alike, and so did F sharp become equal to G flat. etc. The cost of this mathematical solution was that the Pythagorean pure notes had to be sacrificed.

Purists rejected Pareja's proposal, and it took another 240 years before Bach demonstrated the usefulness of the equal tempered scales. Beginning with the note C, he wrote a piece in C major and then a piece in C minor. The next two pieces began one-half note higher, C sharp, and again he showed that the harmonies held firm even though all five black keys on the clavier had to be engaged. He wrote a total of 24 such pieces, using each of the 12 notes as the first note of a scale and


